

## ANDREW Henry Joseph (Captain) and his son Henry Philip

**Henry Joseph Calkin ANDREW**, son of **George ANDREW** and **Philippa PASCOE**, was born at Mevagissey, Cornwall, England on 20 November 1820.

He was christened at Mevagissey on 6 December the same year.

As an adult, he became a Master Mariner, and after migrating to New Zealand he captained various steamers plying the New Zealand waters.

Aged 34, he married **Mary Isabella LYS** on 26 June 1854 at Sway, Hampshire, England.

Together they gave birth to three daughters:

**Mary Phillipa** born 1858; died 1935

**Frances Anne** born 1859; died 24 July 1859, eight days after her birth (on board the ship *Leonidas* whilst it was berthed in Hong Kong Harbour)

**Isabelle Jessie** born 21 Oct 1861 in China; died 5 Feb 1862

Henry Joseph's wife **Mary Isabella ANDREW** also died aboard a ship, as she was returning to England from a voyage overseas to China. The date of her death was 25 April 1862. She was aged only 35 years.

Widowed **Henry Joseph** married again a year later (28 July 1863).

He married a widow, **Elizabeth Susannah LODGE (nee SMITH)** in Kensington, London, England - her first husband **Edward Thomas LODGE** having died in 1861.

In early 1865, **Henry Joseph** and **Elizabeth ANDREW** migrated to New Zealand, by way of the sailing ship *Lord Nelson*. They went to live in Onehunga, where they gave birth to a son: **Henry Philip ANDREW**, born 30 July 1865. Sadly, he was to die at the young age of eleven years (19 Oct 1876) and was buried in **Saint Peter's Cemetery** (Plot 33) two days later.

**Elizabeth** died 28 January 1888 in Gisborne, where **Henry Joseph** was the then Gisborne Harbour Master. She was buried in the Makaraka Cemetery, Gisborne.

**Henry Joseph** was to live another twelve years after Elizabeth's death. He died 4 October 1900, aged 79 years, and was buried in **Saint Peter's Cemetery, Onehunga**, joining his only son **Henry Philip ANDREW** (Plot 33).

At the time of his death, Henry Joseph was living in Ponsonby, Auckland.
